

### **NEW IN 2021**

#### 1st Street Shelter Clinic

In February, MACH was invited to provide healthcare services at the Porchlight Emergency Men's Shelter. The first clinic held in March was a success. In partnership with the MEDiC program at UW, we continue to have the clinic twice a month and our capacity at the shelter continues to grow.

#### **Monthly Foot Care Clinics**

Our first ever service received an upgrade in 2021. After expanding to offer the foot care clinics at the Salvation Army every other month, we moved to monthly clinics at the Beacon in response to the increased foot care needs.

#### **Community Health Needs Assessment**

We hired 5 individuals with lived experience who administered a total of 251 surveys to people experiencing homelessness in our community. The survey consisted of 72 questions covering demographic information, housing status, physical and mental health, healthcare utilization, substance use, and access to resources.

#### **WAFCC BRONZE SEAL**

With the help of our AmeriCorps VISTA Volunteer, we obtained the Wisconsin Association of Free and Charitable Clinics (WAFCC) Bronze Seal of Excellence. The seal is awarded to clinics that are actively promoting best healthcare practices and maximizing access to quality care.

#### **STAFF GROWTH**

In 2021, our staff grew exponentially. From 1 full time staff to 8, 1 part time staff to 6, and 1.5 AmeriCorps members to hiring both of them after service. We also hired people with lived experience of homeless. With increased capacity, we were able to host a strategic planning with board, staff, and volunteers to plan for MACH's future.

### DAIRY DRIVE

In November 2021, the City of Madison chose MACH in collaboration with Kabba Recovery Services to manage and support the first ever city-sanctioned encampment at Dairy Drive.



Folks started touring the 30-site campground on November 9th, and the first camper moving in on November 18th. We offer healthcare and housing support, mental health services, income assistance, advocacy and legal accompaniment, and transportation services to campers.


